

# He Rangitapu, He Tohu Ora Tairāwhiti Wellbeing Framework

Trust Tairāwhiti received a fantastic amount of feedback from our year-long engagement. All data from post-it-notes, group discussions, presentation notes, and feedback was all transcribed electronically. Transcriptions were then sent back to participants for their sign-off.

The Trust worked with EIT to source local IT interns to interpret the data. Joining Trust Tairāwhiti for 12 weeks was Bachelor of Computing students Krisharn Ngamoki, Roy Boustead, and Sam Ngarimu-Goldsmith. The interns used a software programme called NVivo – to analyse all of the transcribed engagement data.

The analysis enabled us to identify common words, themes, and strands of conversations. The engagement data was organised into wellbeing areas. This determined if we captured unique elements in our engagement that didn't fit previous definitions as identified in Tū ora ai tātou – Living Well Together (the Trusts' research summary of 57 wellbeing frameworks completed before our engagement).

There were strong synergies in the baseline research and the local feedback. Throughout the analysis, all wellbeing areas were connected. However Tairāwhiti engagement showed differing frequencies compared to national data, in which people and communities spoke to various themes.

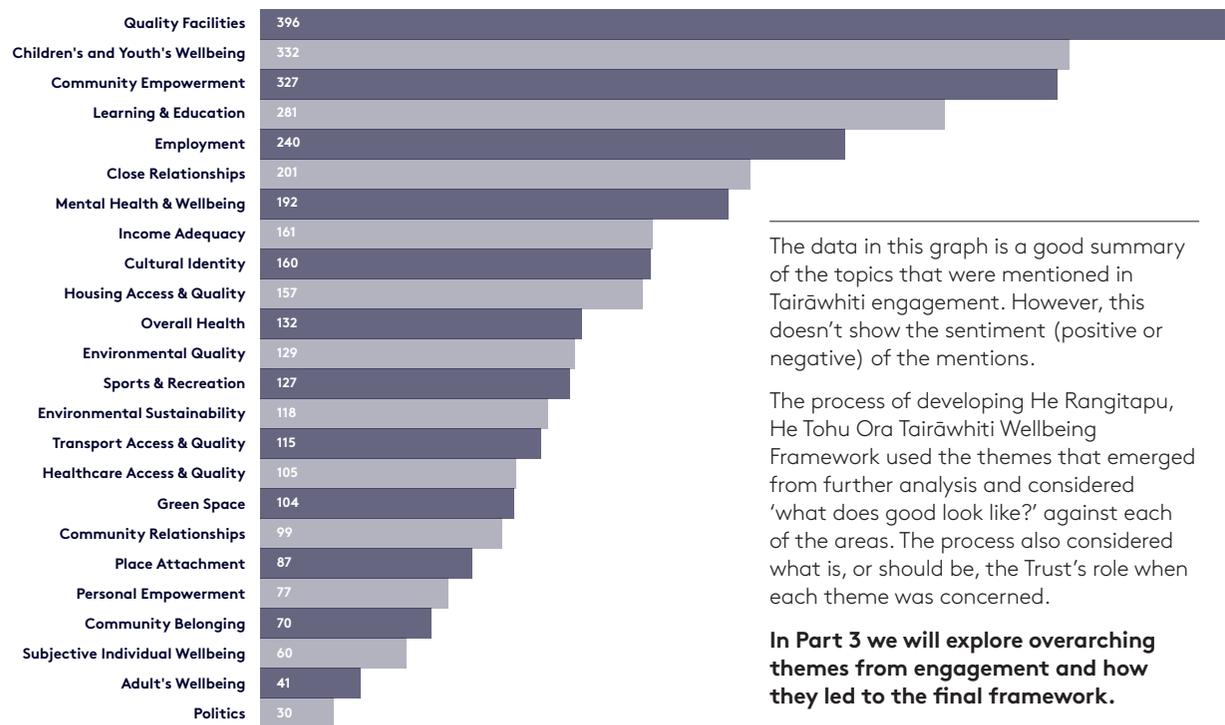
The engagement also helped to identify Tairāwhiti-centric wellbeing priorities and language that made more sense to our communities.

## What did the data tell us?

The following graph shows the overall number of mentions by topic.



### Number of mentions



The data in this graph is a good summary of the topics that were mentioned in Tairāwhiti engagement. However, this doesn't show the sentiment (positive or negative) of the mentions.

The process of developing He Rangitapu, He Tohu Ora Tairāwhiti Wellbeing Framework used the themes that emerged from further analysis and considered 'what does good look like?' against each of the areas. The process also considered what is, or should be, the Trust's role when each theme was concerned.
